During FY 2023, the Four County ADAMhs
Board turned its attention toward several longterm projects designed to improve the lives of
those in our communities who suffer with
mental health and addiction issues. One such
project was bringing women's recovery housing
to the Four County area. The Four County area
has had men's recovery housing for many
years, but lacked a facility with the special skills
needed in order to meet the unique recovery
needs of women.

Recovery houses are safe, supportive and structured living environments designed for people who've recently completed a drug and alcohol rehabilitation program. While living in a recovery house, individuals have the opportunity to develop new habits and routines that support sustained abstinence. Residents are also given the opportunity to apply skills learned during residential treatment to their daily lives. By partnering with Recovery Services of Northwest Ohio and braiding ADAMhs Board funding with state capital improvement and recovery housing funds, the ADAMhs Board will be able to make this important treatment option available locally. The future 8-bed women's recovery house will be located in Fulton County and is scheduled to open in 2024.
